Dear Chairman Womack and Ranking Member Clyburn,

As you begin your work on the Fiscal Year 2026 (FY26) Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations bill, I respectfully request your consideration of the following funding priorities.

1. Monroe County Department of Transportation—Gillett Road Bridge

- a. Agency/Bureau: DOT/Federal Highway Administration
- **b.** Account: Highway Infrastructure Programs
- c. Program: Highway General Fund Programs
- **d. Project Description:** The Monroe County Department of Transportation is seeking \$8,110,000 to remove the aging Gillett Road bridge. The funding would be used to remove the bridge, fill and regrade the location, and construct a new road to replace the bridge. This bridge carries a county highway that is a vital local connector in the Spencerport area. It is used daily by multiple school buses, as it connects school facilities that are located on both sides of the bridge. It is a route to the commercial district in the Village of Spencerport and is used as a route by EMS providers to access parts of the area that are north of the Erie Canal. It is a concern for fire safety as there are three properties located between the canal bridge and this bridge that have decreased fire and rescue access. Additionally, there are multiple businesses located in a business park south of the bridge that utilized it daily to get to areas north of the bridge and must now detour around the bridge.

 - **d. Project Description:** The Rochester Genesee Regional Transportation Authority is seeking \$1,600,000 for a boil-off capture system that would capture, compress, and store gaseous hydrogen where it can then be used to fuel buses rather than being vented into the atmosphere.
